

III. 57. PSEUDOPOLYPOSIS IN NON-SPECIFIC ULCERATIVE COLITIS.  
(Distance of 12 cm.)

In the upper part of the rectum and the commencement of the sigmoid colon there are many outgrowths of varying form and size. The valves have a rigid appearance, the mucous membrane is uneven but firm and somewhat redder than on the outgrowths.

Pseudopolyposis does not differ in appearance from polypoidal adenomata. Pathologically, however, it is an inflammatory hyperplasia. It does not cause symptoms or malaise, but its generation and removal do not call for treatment. It may, however, occur several months after the onset of the severe form of ulcerative colitis.
